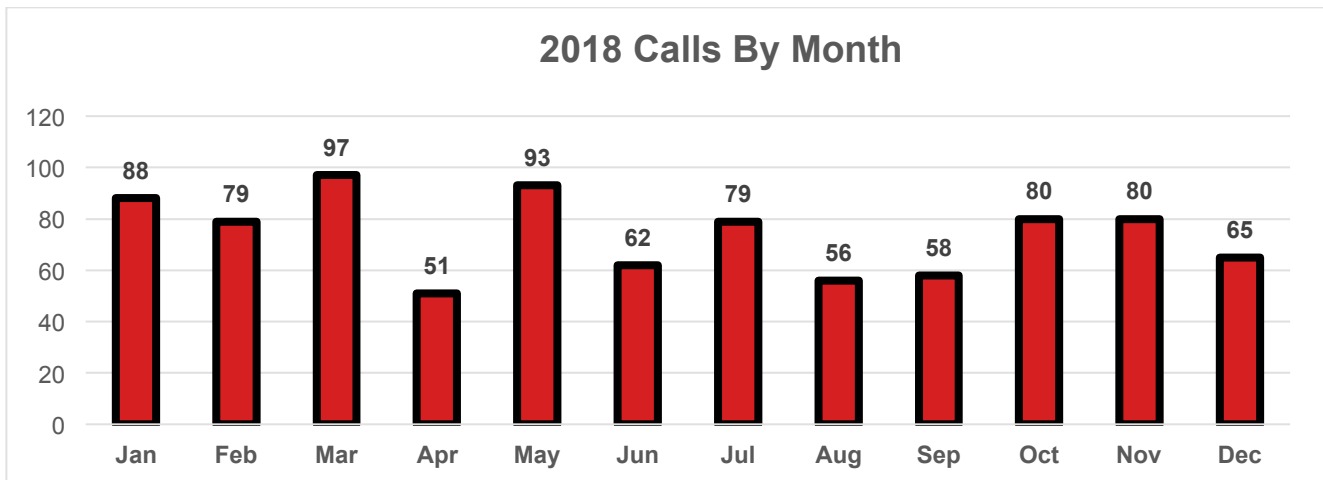

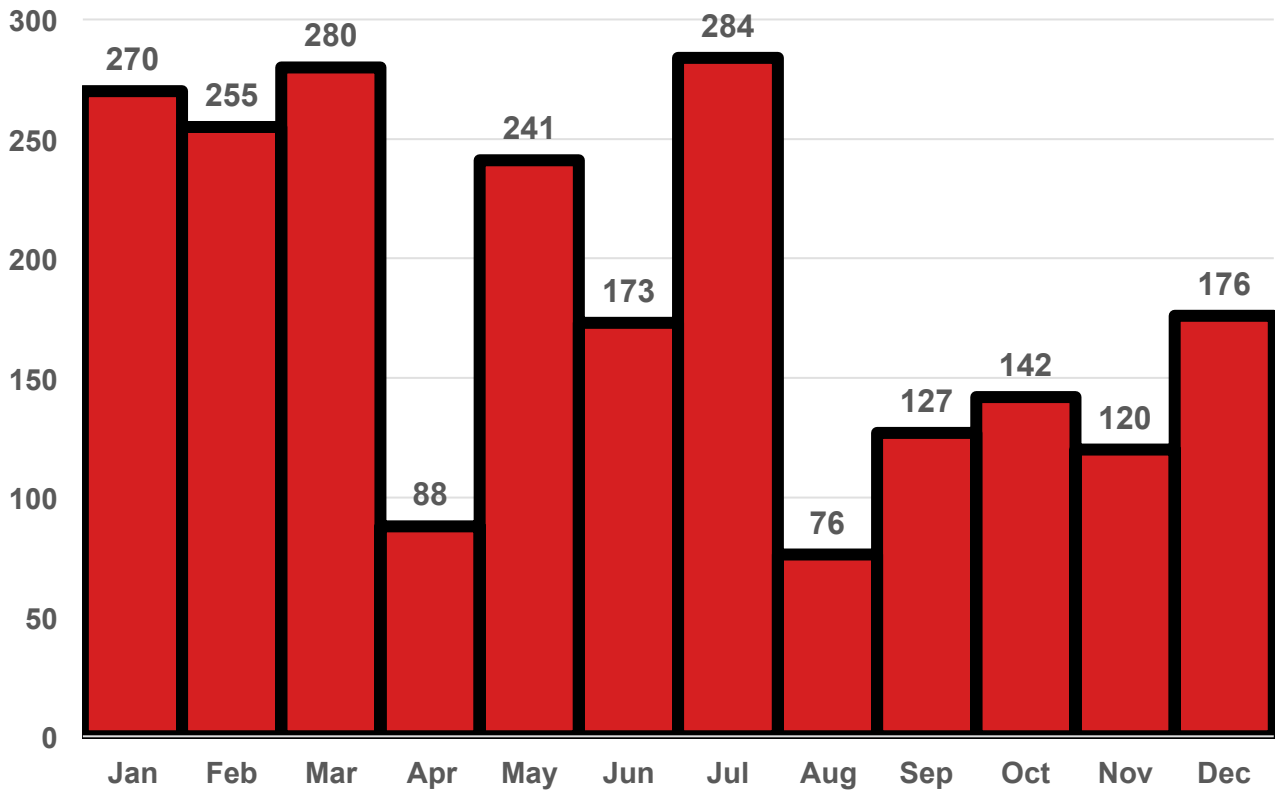

### Total Man Hours Per Month

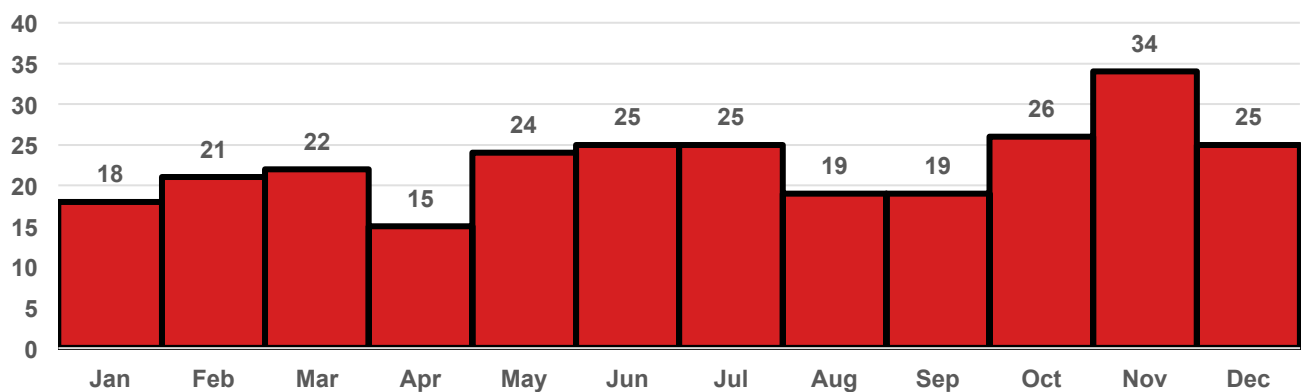
